

## Recommended Supplies

This is a general list of recommended supplies and advice. You will be provided all field tools, paleontology gear, and transportation to dig sites. Restrooms and showers are available at the Bunkhouse.

Lodging: Guests will be lodged in the Marmarth Bunkhouse, a dormitory-style historic railroad building. Rooms have power, but the building has no air conditioning except the common area. Window fans are provided but you may want to bring an additional fan or other 115 volt appliances to help you stay cool. (Please no window mounted AC units.)

- As this is a dormitory-style building most rooms are designed for a single person having only a single twin or full bed. Only 1 or 2 rooms have multiple beds and if you wish to share a room please email us a request.
- If you have room, we recommend you bring your own pillow and bedding/sleeping bag in the event there is a shortage.
- Bring your own toiletries: towels, soap, toothbrush, etc. Also, bring a roll of toilet paper you can store in your field pack.
- There will be some down time, but there is no wifi available at the Bunkhouse. Feel free to bring portable devices but plan to use your own data plan most of the time.

**Meals:** Food is not provided and you are responsible for packing your own lunches. There is one common Bunkhouse refrigerator as well as a second refrigerator in the lab house. Guests will have access to aproximately 1.25 cubic ft of refrigeration and should bring their own coolers.

- Purchasing breakfast and lunch supplies in advance is recommended, but there is a store in nearby Baker, MT.
- Dinner: You are welcome to dine at the Pastime (open for dinner Tuesday through Sunday) or any restaurant in the neighboring towns.
- Ice and snacks are available at the Marmarth coffee shop and convenience store (Little Missouri Smoke Shop).

Other Supplies: All tools, adhesives, collecting supplies and paleo gear are provided for you by your guide. Guests should pack as if they are going on a day hike.

- Field clothes:
  - Wear full length pants and shirts that will protect you from the sun.
  - Boots that extend above the ankle with thick soles that can hold up against cactus needles.
  - Snake gaiters
  - Hat
  - Knee pads and cushions
  - Gloves
  - Insect Repellent
  - Sunscreen
- Field pack to carry: sunscreen, water bottles, lunch box, personal toiletries, notebook, etc.
  - You will need to carry all of your own water. About a gallon is recommended.
  - Small first-aid kit.
  - You may also be required to help carry some additional field supplies.

**Vehicles:** We provide transportation to dig sites and generally we will meet you at the Bunkhouse. On rare occasions you may be required to meet at another location, such as a ranch entrance, before being shuttled to a site.

Other Lodging: There are only a few electrical hook-up locations in Marmarth, ND. Please let us know if you plan on bringing a Camper or RV or are planning to overnight anywhere else.

Check-in is at the Marmarth bunkhouse from 5:30 - 6:30 p.m. the evening prior to the first field day. Orientation to follow!
